## Family Joy!

Our Christmas celebrations were full of light, love, and joy! We rejoiced with family and friends of every kind and from every place. You're invited to celebrate and reflect with us as we enter into the Lenten and Easter seasons at your family church...All Saints'.

Grace and peace to you! The peace of the post-Christmas season leads us into a greater time of silence, reflection, and the coming of Easter joy.

Before we reach the light that falls into Christ's blessedly empty tomb, I invite you all to join with me in the observance of a most Holy Lent. We'll have many opportunities for prayer, study, and worship in ways that mirror the season and deepen our spiritual growth. Most notable (and noticeable) is our switch to the Rite I service for 10:00 on Sundays, and the movement of our altar to face the east as we await the sun and the Son.

If you've never experienced worship in a setting such as this, I encourage you to enter into it fully. The celebrant will have her back to you—but I assure you that the reasons are sound, and actually brings us closer together rather than imposing distance. When we're all facing the same direction in the Eucharistic Prayer, it becomes increasingly clear to us that we are all praying together, regardless of whose voice is heard!

And because the language of Rite I may seem unfamiliar to some, my preaching throughout the season will focus on that Eucharistic Prayer. Piece by piece, we'll learn how it was written, the story it tells, and why we include it still, more than a thousand years after it was first inspired and written.

We'll also have the opportunity for Book Study on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 pm, beginning on February 27th. I'm humbled and honored that the book chosen is one that my seminary classmate and I wrote after our work in Kenya in 2012, and I invite you all to join us.

## Youth Group News!

In the coming months do not be surprised if someone – and I cannot imagine who – taps you on the shoulder and says, “Would you be interested in doing \_\_\_\_\_ for/with the Youth Group?” An upcoming theme is to ask what we could be doing inter-generationally, both for the benefit of our teens and for the benefit of the parish. It is already a given, but, I contend, it can be taken further.

How far it has already been taken is seen in the parish's support for our lock-ins. We are hosting another on April 13. We are again counting on your support at our Bake Sale on March 18. We will be grateful for help feeding the sleep-deprived contingent with breakfast on April 14.

We have a trip into New York City planned on Saturday March 24, this time swinging through Soho, Little Italy, Chinatown, and the Lower East Side. There will be some walking involved, but we'll also be making a lot of stops – for food you can be sure, but also for some fascinating and unusual sites, ones that do not figure prominently in the travel books. One stop will be the Tenement Museum, which is run by the National Park System. It is for that visit that I ask you let me know your interest **by Sunday March 3**, as we will need to buy tickets in advance. (You can decide after March 3 about joining the March 24 trip, but you would probably miss out on that portion.)

We are wrapping up C.S. Lewis' “Mere Christianity” now, soon to move on to some other topics, some centering on The Book of Common Prayer. (It is for your participation in one of our meetings that you may be hearing from me.)

Beyond the service component of the lock-in, we will soon pick up again on some of our Outreach projects and, perhaps, embark on some new ones. These include our work at Evergreen Cemetery in Plainfield and the Fanwood Nature Center.

Will Loop's Eagle project is coming to fruition, focusing on the room under the Guild Room, which will, in part, establish a place for our Youth Group to play games like foosball, and perhaps just hang out. Check out what he and the Scouts he has enlisted have accomplished.
