## Youth Group News!

After the trip to the Bronx Zoo in late September, the Youth Group remains engaged and active. On Saturday October 28, we joined St. Mark's and Grace in Plainfield, as well as Canon Debi Clarke from the Diocese, on our ongoing service project at Evergreen Cemetery in Plainfield, continuing with our work to maintain the grounds and clear the perimeter. While there, we met a man named Victor Thomas, who has received a grant to fix the headstones that have sadly suffered neglect or been vandalized over the years, and we will meet with him in the coming weeks to discuss how we might help with his project. On Saturday, November 11, we returned to the Fanwood Nature Center with a number of other parishioners enduring the cold, enhancing the paths with chips, and very much impressing our host Phyllis Sandrock with our hard work and sense of civic duty.

With C.S. Lewis' "Mere Christianity," we are now into Book III and find ourselves grappling with the topics of morality and virtues – both cardinal and theological. Next up, forgiveness and humility...



What's on our horizon? No doubt much more, but at least a couple of lock-ins, both involving our staple-program – Stop Hunger Now... The first is the annual Diocesan event at the Cathedral in Trenton overnight from Friday December 15 to Saturday December 16. We know that we count on Debi Clarke to organize an event that includes both top-flight music and an uplifting service. Also, in the coming weeks we will be planning

our fourth Convocation-wide lock-in, which is likely to be in the late March, early April timeframe. Especially if we host the event again, we will be counting on you, as we so often have, for your support.
